### **Network Development**

- <u>Youth Employability Peer Learning Network</u>, hosted by Umsizi Fund: a community for youth employment professionals in Africa and the Middle East representing organisations that are demand-driven and focused on systems change
- Kenya Solutions Exchange Convening 2020, supported by Harambee Youth Employment Accelerator, LGT Venture Philanthropy, Vitol Foundation, Imaginable Futures and Umsizi Fund: brought together leaders from public and private sectors, funders, skills organisations and youth empowerment groups to collaboratively design initiatives to address gaps in the Kenyan employment ecosystem
- <u>Jobtech Alliance</u>, a continent-wide initiative supported by Mercy Corps, which aims to create a stronger ecosystem for those working to provide skilling, linkages to jobs and employment protection through tech platforms

## Learning Design and Programme Implementation

We provide partners with engaging and research-driven online, blended and offline learning experiences. We help clients transform their learning objectives into programme designs, lessons and activities, and assessments. We work to create culturally-relevant solutions that make the learning experience rich and engaging. Examples of work include:

- Tellistic Technology Services: Through this partnership, we designed content for accelerator programmes in Kenya and Uganda for Microsoft, the Uganda Ministry of ICT, and UK-Kenya Tech Hub (an initiative of FCDO); we've supported expansion and localisation of this programme to Ghana and Nigeria
- Future Fund for Education: We supported the design and implementation of 6-week <u>accelerator</u> for African education entrepreneurs in partnership with the African Leadership Group



• Kenyan Caregiver Digital Literacy Training: Through <u>Keep Kenya Learning</u> and with the support of FCDO's Digital Access Programme, we designed training to be delivered by community partners, school leaders and parent associations to caregivers in rural and urban low-income communities in Kenya


- Busara Center for Behavioral Economics: Designed and delivered short and long-term training for client management (1 day training) and executive teams (9-month journey)
